

Safely Dispose of Unwanted Medicine

Drug overdose is the leading cause of unintentional death in Washington State and 63% of these deaths involved prescription-type pain relieving medications. Washington is one of only 16 states in which drug overdoses cause more deaths than traffic accidents. As a way of preventing these unnecessary deaths parents need to keep prescriptions safe by:

- Keep these medicines locked
- Keep track of quantities of these medicines
- Dispose of expired and unused medicines in a safe way - DO NOT FLUSH DOWN THE TOILET

Only two counties in the state - Snohomish and Clark - have medicine return programs that accept controlled substances, such as the opiate-type medicines. Visit www.medicinereturn.com for a complete list of pharmacies and police stations that accepted unused or expired prescriptions.

Washington State recently passed the **911 Good Samaritan Law** which provides legal protection from drug possession charges for “good Samaritans” who seek medical help for someone having a drug overdose as well as the person having an overdose.
